- Call to Order and Roll Call: The meeting was called to order by the Chair.

- III. - IV. Adoption of Minutes review / discussion / action
 - A) Regular Meeting March 11, 2020: A motion was made to adopt the minutes as written; motion seconded; all in favor; motion passed.
- V. Reports / General Business review / discussion /action
 - A) Classes discussion/action
 - i. Virginia's spring class: Intro to Organic Gardening- Cancelled due to COVID19 Virginia intends to reschedule this course for the fall.
 - ii. Frank's class- seed starting- Cancelled due to COVID19
 Frank is unsure if or when this course will be rescheduled.
 - B) Other Events discussion: None. The capacity of the Ag Commission to run its class offerings has been greatly reduced due to guidelines about public gatherings.
 - C) Killingly Community Garden meeting / review / discussion / action
 - i. Staff update on KCG: Due to COVID-19, the Killingly Community Garden has decided to cease accepting applications for garden plots. The few individuals whom have already applied and paid for a garden bed will be allowed to continue, however all of the remaining beds will be maintained by garden members as donation beds for local food pantries.
 - D) Tomato Festival progress report: A discussion ensued on the potential that Tomato Festival may be cancelled. The consensus of the members is that the town should wait until sometime in July before making a decision as to whether to hold or cancel the Festival. With all the cancellations of fairs and events, food and craft vendors are losing a lot of opportunities for making money, especially non-profit organizations. These folks would most likely welcome the chance to sell their goods. The Farmers Market is already operating and

- have their protocols in place for customer and farmer safety. Some concern was expressed about a chili tasting event in terms of serving. If guidelines for serving food would be too cumbersome, the chili event could be omitted.
- E) Green News Newsletter progress report: A discussion ensued about compiling a newsletter over the next few week's to alert subscribers about the offerings of local food producers. Virginia and Frank will be coordinating the effort to reach out to farms for info on what they're selling, and compile it for the next newsletter.
- F) Winter/Spring Farmer's Market— discussion/action: The last winter farmers market was cancelled due to COVID-19. The Summer/Spring markets are open, with restrictions and guidelines for social distancing and PPE.
