- V. Adoption of Minutes review / discussion / action

#### D) Killingly Community Garden – meeting / review / discussion / action

Chris announced they seem to be doing better this year; the Garden Coordinator, Sharon is keeping the lines of communication open; mentioned they are working on Linda's Memorial Giving Garden; they are trying to get the Danielson Fire Department to fill up the "new" water tank. Virginia saw an article in the Killingly Villager / Community regarding planting day.

# E) Tomato Festival – meeting / progress report

Ann-Marie – the planning is going strong; Frank has scheduled three (3) musicians already; still looking for crafters / vendors; Ann-Marie went to Spring Fest; and will go to the Summer Solstice to get business cards from crafters / vendors. Still doing the chili cook off; the children's' tent / activities are being handled by Beth Knowlton and her students; we have a new \$1,000 donation from NYCPCO so we may have two major sponsors this year. ### VII. Regulations – review / revisions / discussion / action

- A) Town of Killingly Zoning Regulations Section 585 "Agriculture"
- B) Borough of Danielson Zoning Regulations Section 585 "Agriculture"

What will happen if someone buys a farm where the barn is close to the boundary lot; and they want to house livestock? If there are pigs, the statute is very specific – no closer than 150 feet and there are no exceptions; as well as the distance of manure piles from the neighbors.

Adam thinks we need to define manure pile. What constitutes a pile? Is there a size of a pile?

Virginia Keith will reach out to her contact at the CT Farm Bureau to see if they have finished review of the regulations. NRCS; Bill Purcell would be a contact to have someone review the new regulations. Farm Service Agency; Alicia (New Director) would be the contact.

### VIII. Plan of Conservation and Development – review/discussion/action

Ann-Marie explained the POCD; it was decided that during the July meeting the AG COMM will discuss their involvement with the POCD. Ann-Marie explained that the AG COMM is scheduled for August; however, if they feel comfortable they could attend in July; for an open discussion and input from AG COMM.
