W. Scholl said that we should stay away from narcotic statistics. R. Duquette disagrees we should put the narcotic statistics to make people aware. R. Duquette would like to see the calls for service for the last five years to see where the calls are trending. T. Esposito will get that information and bring it back for our next meeting or T. Wakefield stated that she could pick it up. T. Wakefield & W. Scholl feel that maps would be a good way to show the types of calls it will give a good visual. R. Duquette stated that the first survey we should accompany maps and the second survey have a more

comprehensive package. T. Wakefield mentioned that April we will start televising the meetings. Possibly put together a power point presentation utilizing slides of maps of Burglary, Larceny, Assaults, Narcotics harassment/criminal mischief/trespass and attach that power point presentation to the Town website. R. Duquette stated that he hasn't seen any publications in the Villager about Law Enforcement Strategies. T. Wakefield **April** crime statistics presentation meeting to start @ 6:00 pm. R. Duquette feels we should let the survey run for 2 to 3 months until 05-15-15 to give Sean time to compile results. R. Duquette mentioned for the **May** meeting that Plainfield Police Chief will come to our meetings and help us out with whatever we may need. T. Wakefield during the **June** meeting we can go over 1<sup>st</sup> results of survey. R. Duquette stated that we should have a more in depth survey and present this one to the Council. A. Shatney isn't comfortable with setting a timeline. T. Wakefield stated once we have the publics' perception on law enforcement we will have a better idea. The meeting scheduled for July 2, 2015 was changed to July 9, 2015 all commission members were fine with the change. T. Wakefield for **July's** meeting see if we can get Montville police officials to join our meeting. T. Wakefield said for our **August** meeting talk about coverage for Killingly, identify obstacles and discuss ways to maximize the current/near-future personnel (Resident Troopers, constables). **September – November** educate the public and launch a 2<sup>nd</sup> survey from September – October 15, 2015. T. Wakefield for **December** survey results finalized and put together commission recommendation to be forwarded to the Town Council. T. Wakefield feels that the Resident Troopers should be more visible.
