The revisions included alphabetizing the Boards and Commissions and adding the Boards and Commissions which had been previously listed in the Charter. The revisions to Chapters 8, 12 and 15 was to reclassify the formation, purpose and duties of the Board or Commission to Chapter 2. TM Calorio outlined minor edits recommended by the Town Attorney. The Town Attorney recommends removing expired special commissions.

b. Discussion and possible action on the recommendation of the draft amendment to Chapter 14 – Firefighter and Emergency Volunteer Personnel Property Tax Abatement TM Calorio presented the proposed amendment to Chapter 14 to incorporate new State legislative language which increased the maximum abatement. Members discussed current participation in the abatement program. TM Calorio outlined minor edits recommended by the Town Attorney.
