- Get tested if you have symptoms of COVID19, regardless of vax status
 - Get tested before and after travel if unvaccinated

Additional Information about Testing

Who Should be Tested for COVID-19?

- People who have <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19, regardless of vaccination status or prior infection.
- Most people who have had <u>close contact</u> (within 6 feet for a total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period) with someone with confirmed COVID-19.
 - <u>Fully vaccinated</u> people with no COVID-19 symptoms do not need to be tested following an exposure to someone with COVID-19.
 - People who have tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 3 months and recovered do not need to get tested following an exposure as long as they do not develop new symptoms.
- People who have taken part in activities that put them at higher risk for COVID-19 because they cannot
 physically distance as needed to avoid <u>exposure</u>, such as travel, attending large social or mass
 gatherings, or being in crowded or poorly-ventilated indoor settings.
- People who have been asked or referred to get tested by their healthcare provider or state, tribal, territorial or local health department. (Note – you do not need to be experiencing symptoms or have a doctor's order to be tested.)
- Get tested regularly, even without symptoms, if you're living in some of our most populated cities and towns, especially if you live in close proximity to others. Visit ct.gov/prioritytesting.
- Children can be tested if a parent/legal guardian is with them to provide consent.
- Test results are usually available within 24-36 hours.

Priority Workforce Testing

As part of the State of Connecticut's testing program, Connecticut's testing partners are providing priority access for childcare and early childhood staff, teachers, and first responders. Priority access is intended for staff who need to get tested quickly, to ensure their workday is not interrupted – but is not intended for the family and friends of said workers.

Here is who qualifies:

Teachers/School Staff (including Bus Drivers) • Early Childhood/Child Care Professionals Police Officers • Fire Fighters • Paramedics/EMT • National Guard • Dispatchers

COVID-19 Contact Tracing

You should get tested if you have been contacted by a public health professional or contact tracer and told that you have been in contact with a known case of COVID-19. If you test positive, you can expect a call from a contact tracer, and to have a detailed conversation with them about who you have been in contact with. In this way, you can help to save lives and stop the spread of COVID-19. Calls will show up on your phone as CTCOVIDTRACE or may be from your local health department. Your personal health information will be protected in this process. You will not be asked to call a "1-900" number. You will not be contacted via social media or asked for financial information.
