In general, documents such as Lis Pendens, Certificates of Foreclosure, Affidavits, and Releases of Lis Pendens are not subject to the higher fee because the nominee did not initiate nor are they a direct party in the action. The attached Lis Pendens is an example of one that would be charged \$53 for the first page.

There may be unusual circumstances and unique documents that may require your judgment. For example, MERS actually takes ownership of the property through a foreclosure action. See the attached Satisfaction of Judgment where MERS redeemed and is the grantee. The fee for recording this document would be \$159 for the first page and \$5 for each additional page under the Remittance Rule for Other Documents.

If you are presented with an unusual or very unique document and cannot determine the proper fee, you may want to ask for assistance from your town's legal counsel.

Section 81 (h) of the bill states "the town clerk shall retain forty-nine dollars of such fees, thirty-nine dollars of which shall become part of the general revenue of such municipality and ten dollars of which shall be deposited into the town clerk fund..."

This town clerk fund could be combined with the \$1 from the Community Investment fund that you receive OR may be kept separate.

**Clerks <u>DO NOT</u> submit community investment or historic document money to the state on any MERS recordings **
