The Reconvened Annual Town Meeting of electors and citizens qualified to vote in the Town Meetings of the Town of Killingly, Connecticut, shall be held, pursuant to Section 701 of the Killingly Town Charter, in the auditorium of the Killingly High School, 226 Putnam Pike, Dayville, Connecticut on Monday, June 3, 2013 at 7:30 p.m. to consider the following:

1. To consider, modify and/or approve the following ordinance:

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE OPERATING BUDGET FOR THE TOWN OF KILLINGLY
FOR FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2013 - JUNE 30, 2014

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KILLINGLY that, in accordance with Section 1005 of the Town Charter, the budget for the Town of Killingly, Connecticut, for the Fiscal year July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2014, in the amount of \$ **13,465,739** allocated to General Government and **\$38,606,021** allocated to Education, for a total combined budget of **\$52,071,760** be adopted.

1. "SHALL THE GENERAL GOVERNMENT BUDGET FOR THE TOWN OF KILLINGLY, CONNECTICUT, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$13,465,739 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2014 BE APPROVED?"
2. "SHALL THE KILLINGLY BOARD OF EDUCATION BUDGET IN THE AMOUNT OF \$38,606,021 FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2012 BE APPROVED?"
