**ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE KILLINGLY CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 14,
TAXATION, SECTION 14-6(E) (1) (B)**

Current language: (Ord. No. 97-001, §§1-4, 1-14-97; Ord. No. 99-001, 1-12-99)

b. Projects pursuant to this subsection € must have a minimum of *two hundred million dollars (\$2,000,000) sic* in estimated initial costs of construction, rehabilitation, machinery and equipment, excluding the costs of real property acquisition.

Proposed language:

b. Projects pursuant to this subsection (e) must have a minimum of **twenty-five million dollars (\$25,000,000)** in estimated initial costs of construction, rehabilitation, machinery and equipment, excluding the costs of real property acquisition.
